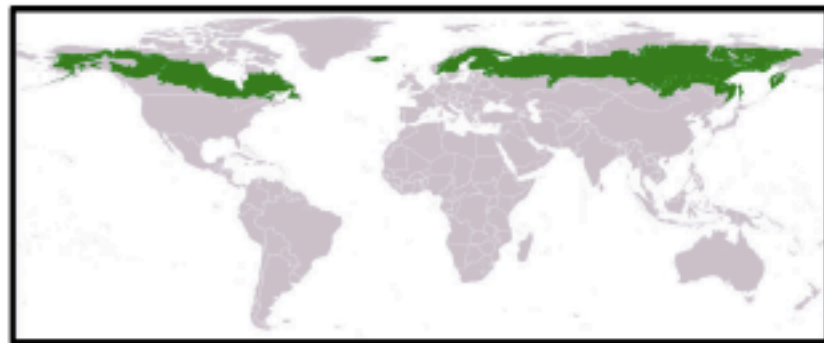


Coniferous Forest

A coniferous forest is land covered mostly with coniferous trees. A coniferous tree grows needles instead of broad leaves and cones instead of flowers. It has green needles year round, even through the cold, white winter. Conifers are also called evergreens. Pine trees, fir trees, and spruce trees are conifers.



Coniferous forests are found in the Northern Hemisphere (green zone on the map). This region is called the boreal forest and taiga. This region experiences four seasons in a year: winter, spring, summer, and fall. A coniferous tree can survive in the winter snow and the summer sun; it has adapted to the variety of weather in this region.

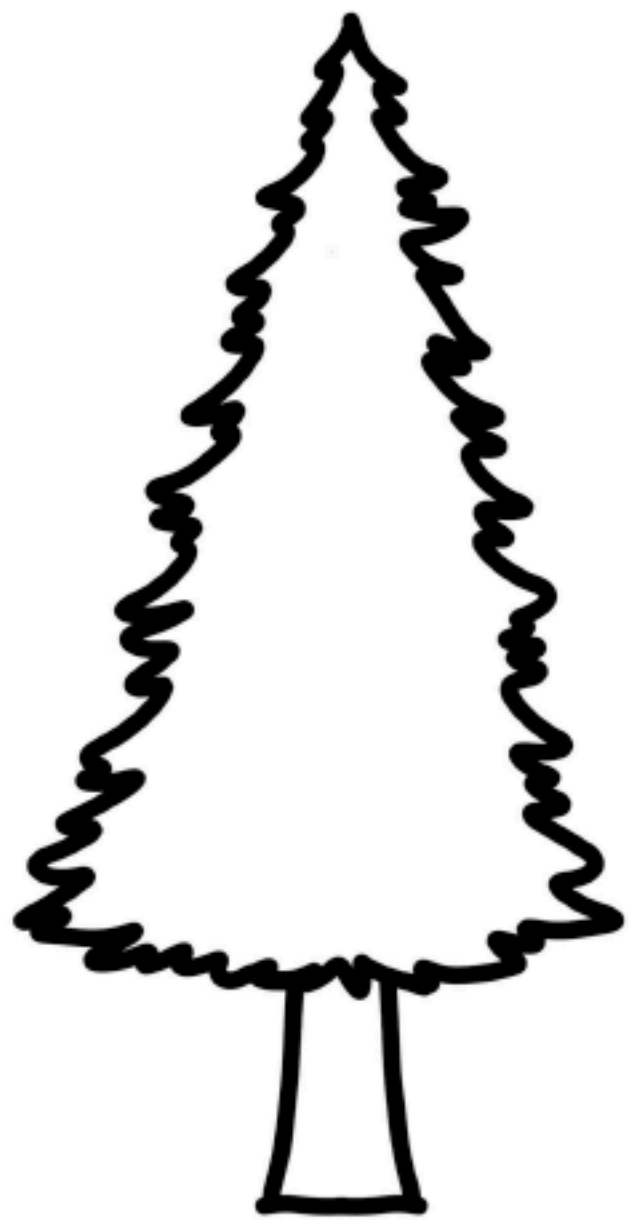
